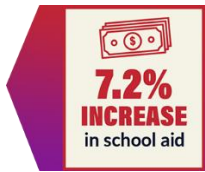


WE CAN LOOK BACK ON 2022 WITH PRIDE:

This is much-needed money for student support, facility maintenance, and so much more — and is a start at making up for years of NYS budget neglect.



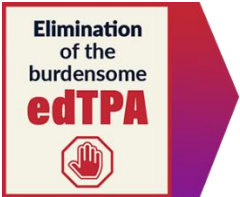
Public higher education in New York can begin to address the critical shortage of faculty.

Home-care nurses were not covered by work rules for other nurses. We finally fixed this problem and eliminated mandatory overtime.



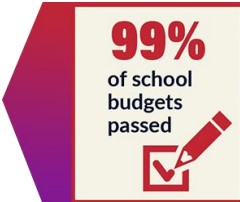
The edTPA, a test administered by the giant corporation Pearson, was a barrier to teacher licensure. Not anymore.
